Vaughan Carlson's experience in the test engineering industry started in 1975 at General Dynamics (Fort Worth, TX) where he served for six years as a Test Engineer regarding unit-level functional testing for Air Data Equipment on the F-16. Vaughan then transferred to Schlumberger, where he was in sales support for Factron 303S/333 in-circuit testers and Factron 7XX functional and in-circuit testers. After working at Schlumberger for six years, Vaughan suffered a lay-off, so he started VALUE Engineering as a part-time job while working full time at SCI Manufacturing (now Sanmina-SCI). Vaughan was the Principal Engineer at SCI, managing the technical aspects of SCI's seventeen facilities, providing training and guidance regarding test strategies. Vaughan left SCI in 1994 to put his full time and efforts into his own firm.
